The North American plains tribes had constellations, stars and legends unique to their culture just as the Greeks and Romans did. Hear some of the many wonderful sacred star stories Native American tribes told and learn how the night skies influenced tribal life. The Native American Storytelling program will take place on Saturday, September 15 in the field to the West of the Observatory building. Your host, Native American, Jan Brooks, of the Ojibwe tribe will begin her first story at 8:30 p.m.

To insure your comfort, you may wish to bring a folding chair or blanket to sit on. A good bug repellent is also advised. There is no charge for the *Native American Storytelling* program, however if you would also like to take in , and see their many exhibits, regular admission charges will apply.
