WICHITA, Kan. - Shocker bowlers showed up to win at the Intercollegiate Singles Sectional Qualifier. Junior Jazreel Tan (Singapore) and freshman Francois Lavoie (Quebec City, Canada), each won the top qualifying spot at the Euless, Texas, Singles Sectional tournament, advancing them to the Intercollegiate Singles Championships in Lincoln, Neb.

Tan won the women's division by shooting 1,344 for six games, a 224 average. She led the women's qualifying by 58 pins.

Lavoie captured the men's No. 1 spot by shooting 1,389, resulting in a 231.5 average for the tournament.

"I felt like I was throwing the ball well. I was able to repeat shots," Lavoie said. "Also, I was able to see the moves ahead of time. It felt good to be on top of the moves."

Along with Tan and Lavoie, two additional Shockers – seniors Geoffrey Young (Denton, Texas) and Kevin Tatrow (Bel Aire, Kan.) – will be headed to the Singles Championships. Young finished in second place with a total of 1,371 pins, just 18 pins behind Lavoie. Tatrow rounded out the top six in the men's field by shooting 1,300 for the six-game tournament.

Narrowly missing cut on the men's side were juniors Miguel Lopez (Peoria, Ariz.) and Marcus Berndt (Malmo, Sweden). Lopez finished seventh while Berndt finished eighth.

Sophomores Tannya Roumimper (Bandung, Indonesia) and Holly Harris (Long Prairie, Minn.) barely missed the cut on the women's side, finishing fifth and sixth, respectively.
