

Graduate Staff Assistantship in Flute



Description

Assistantship requires an approximate load of 6 hours per week. Duties include:

1. Performance participation and *enrollment in the WSU Symphony Orchestra and the WSU Symphonic Wind Ensemble.

* Enrollment can be for credit or no credit depending on specific degree requirements.

2. Assisting the Flute Professor with clerical work and recruitment activities

Financial Package:

Total financial package includes a stipend of \$5,500.00 per school year and a waiver of non-resident tuition to resident tuition rates. This tuition waiver is for the actual semester of appointment and does not include waiver of student fees. The stipend is prorated over nine months, with the first payment given in mid-September. Stipend is subject to legislative approval.
