If you are a transfer student under age 21, with fewer than 24 credit hours, you must: Have a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA (on a 4.00 scale on all previous college work and meet the freshman requirements. WSU Transfer Credit Acceptance It is the policy of WSU to accept all credits with the exception of remedial coursework earned at a postsecondary institution accredited by one of the U.S. regional accrediting agencies. Each academic college or department within WSU determines how those credits apply toward a particular degree program. Sometimes there can be a significant difference between what transfers and what counts toward a degree, especially if the courses are vocational in nature.
